

GFWC Juniorette Club Starting A Club - What Do You Need?

- A Juniorette Club must be sponsored by an active GFWC Woman's Club or Junior Club in good standing in GFWC Florida Federation of Women's Clubs, Inc.
- The sponsoring club must assign an advisor/liaison to work with the Juniorette Club. You may have other advisors who will coordinate meetings, projects, etc. but you must have an advisor/liaison from the sponsoring club also.
- To begin a Juniorette club you must have 10 girls.
- Girls ages 12 – 18 are invited to join.
- Begin with an orientation program and explain what the Federation is and what Junioresettes are. You can obtain help with this by contacting the GFWC State Juniorette Advisory Committee. Once the decision has been made to start the club, be sure to contact GFWC (see contact below) to inform them of this start-up.
- Select temporary officers to begin the set-up process. Along with the advisor, plan meeting dates/times and projects. Most clubs meet once a month for a business meeting and will schedule extra volunteer opportunities during the month, as available.
- A Juniorette club year typically runs in sync with the school year. Some meet year round.
- Sample By-Laws are available.
- Discuss and agree to the amount of dues to be paid by each new member. Dues can be used to pay membership fees in GFWC and GFWC Florida as well as to fund projects you may be interested in.
