Your mission is to look over the club report and find the following issues:

1. Find a project that is not a club project and therefore should not be included.

Answer: Epcot's International Food & Wine Half Marathon – one member participated, no details given on how this relates back to the club.

2. Find a project that should be listed as a GFWC Partner Project but it is not.

Answer: Charity of the Month is for UNICEF which is a partner.

3. Find the project that is reported under the incorrect CSP.

Answer: Coupons for Overseas Military should be reported under Public Issues because it is for our military.

4. Find the project that has money listed as Dollars Donated but it should be listed as In Kind Donations.

Answer: (Mosquito Nets to Venezuela – the club purchased mosquito nets so this should be listed under In Kind donations per the handbook “Cash donations are monies or gift cards sent directly from the club whereas in-kind donations are items purchased by the club or donated by club members.”)

5. Find a project that has money listed as In Kind Donation but should be listed as Dollars Donated.

Answer: Gift card donation – “Cash donations are monies or gift cards sent directly from the club whereas in-kind donations are items purchased by the club or donated by club members.”

6. Find a project that needs a more descriptive narrative.

Answer: Vaccines - an acceptable narrative might be ‘Our monthly newsletter included information about the Shot @ Life program at Walgreens. For every vaccine received at a Walgreens during the special period, they donate a vaccine to someone in a developing country through Shot @ Life. The article contained information about the need for tetanus boosters and 7 of our members met on a Saturday to get their shot during the special period so that a shot was also donated. They took a group photo and posted it to the club Facebook page with info on the Shot @ Life program at Walgreen’s to also encourage members of the community to do the same.
